

## About St. Timothy's

St. Timothy's was a mission church from St. Peter's in Ladue and originally held services in the basement of Thompson Center at Ladue and I-270. Our first service on the Mason Rd. property was held on August 20, 1961, in an old farmhouse. The groundbreaking of our first building, now the chapel and multi-purpose room, took place on this same site in June of 1962. The new building was completed in six months, and the first service was held on Sunday, December 16, 1962. The building of the education wing and parish hall was completed in April 1968, and St. Timothy's received parish status at the 129th Diocesan Convention on April 26, 1968. Continued growth enabled the addition of the office space and an enlarged narthex in 1978.

We built our new church, gathering space, narthex, and offices in 2002 and 2003. Our first services were on Easter weekend.
